Dr. Joseph Connors is best known for his clinical investigations into the treatment of Hodgkin lymphoma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, chronic lymphocytic leukemias and multiple myeloma. He is a member of the NCIC CTG's Hematology Site Executive Committee, is chair of the Educational Affairs Committee of the American Society of Hematology, and sits on the scientific advisory boards of the Lymphoma Foundation Canada and the Lymphoma Research Foundation of the United States.

Dr. Connors has published over 250 peer-reviewed scientific articles addressing various aspects of research into lymphoid cancers. Among his many distinctions, in 2010, he was awarded the Karl Musshoff Award for Lifetime Achievement at the 8th International Symposium on Hodgkin Lymphoma in Cologne,

Germany and, in 2007, Dr. Connors received the Ellen Glesby Cohen Leadership Award from the Lymphoma Research Foundation of the United States for leadership in research and treatment for non-Hodgkin lymphoma.

Dr. Connors is a clinical professor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Medical Oncology, at the University of British Columbia, and is Clinical Director of the BC Cancer Agency Centre for Lymphoid Cancer.
